K – Adult Education Programs

In 2012, GCWAC served more than 2,200 students and adults within the Greater Cincinnati region through the annual international education programs.

International Exchange Programs

In 2012, over 375 international visitors came to Cincinnati and met with local professionals and organizations through the U.S. Department of State International Visitor Leadership Program, Ohio University, Windows on America, and Young African Leaders. The visitors stayed in local Cincinnati hotels or family homes and many of the Cincinnati community members hosted dinners for the visitors.

Public Programs

GCWAC served 200 business, academic, and civic leaders in 2012 through Global Gaggles: Views from Abroad, luncheons, and foreign policy discussions. Topics included Presidential Primaries, Conflict Resolution, Interfaith Dialogue, and Vietnam.
